SUBJECT: Visit of Herr Globke

1. This memorandum suggests action on the part of the DCI. Such requested action is contained in paragraph 5.

2. We have now received confirmation that State Secretary Hans Globke of the German Federal Chancellery will arrive in Washington on 25 February 1971. You may recall that Herr Globke's visit to the U. S. had been off and on since May 1955 when it was first proposed that he would accompany Chancellor Adenauer and after the official part of the visit would spend a few days as CIA's guest. In JUT 0546 dated 14 May 1955, initiated by Mr. Gordon Stewart, coordinated by Mr. Helms, and released by the DCI, Herr Globke was extended an official invitation. The May 1955 visit never came off but Herr Globke was assured that the invitation remained open. The invitation was reissued by the DCI during his summer 1956 visit to Germany.

3. In November 1956 details for Herr Globke's trip were firmed up, confirmation of arrival received, etc. but there was a last-minute cancellation because of the Chancellor's concern that Globke might be called as a witness in the John trial then taking place. In connection with the November visit, the DCI agreed to give a dinner in honor of Herr Globke for which invitations were already issued when the trip was cancelled. The list of individuals who were invited in November is enclosed herewith as Attachment "A." Since at least two of the individuals on the November list are unavailable, we have substituted a slightly amended list, see Attachment "B." As an alternative, the DCI may wish to consider an informal small dinner at his home in which case the proposed guest list would include the persons listed in Attachment "C." As Dr. Globke speaks practically no English it would seem desirable that Messrs. Folgar and [redacted] be on hand as interpreters.

4. Arrangements to make the time available for the dinner and for a visit to the DCI's office have already been made through Mr. [redacted].

5. Following his visit to Washington, Dr. Globke will be given a

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Chief's tour including visits to New Orleans, Boston, and New York. Mr.
