## Legal Basis

- Schengen Border Code

**Art.17 and 18** “...MS shall assist each other and maintain close and constant cooperation...”

- EUROSUR regulation

**Art.5** “...the NCC shall be a single point of contact for the exchange of information and for the cooperation with other MS an Agency”

- EBCG Regulation

**Art.4** “cooperation between MS supported and coordinated by the Agency”

## Ways to cooperate

Provide assistance to MS



Surveillance system sharing



Joint risk analysis




Joint patrolling



## Specific provision for Ireland and UK

- May take place on bilateral or multilateral agreements
- Or one or several neighboring MS based on agreement
- Agreements shall be notified to the Commission
- Information of the MS NSP, transmitted to FX for the purposes of the ESP and CPIP - shall be limited.
- Information collected by Ireland and the U.K. relevant for the ESP and CPIP Information shared by neighboring M.S. according to the Eurosur regulation.
- Onward transmission by Ireland or the U.K. is forbidden




# Cooperation with neighboring countries

- Art.9.9 “the NCC of MS may share with each other directly and in near-real time... ”
- MS NSP of external border sections
- Position, status and type of own assets operating
