On 19 July 2019 the Frontex Fundamental Rights Officer (FRO) received your complaint which was registered under the reference number CMP-2019-00009. In reference to it, we would like to inform you that based on Article 72 (4) of the Regulation 2016/1624 on European Border and Coast Guard (Regulation)<sup>1</sup> the FRO has reviewed the complaint. According to Article 8 of the Agency's Rules on the Complaints Mechanism<sup>2</sup> your complaint cannot be considered as admissible due to the following reason:

The actions that allegedly violated your fundamental rights were not performed by Frontex staff or within the framework of any Agency activity (joint operation, return operation, return intervention, rapid border intervention, pilot project or migration management support team deployment).

We kindly inform you that irrespective of this inadmissibility decision in relation to the European Border and Coast Guard Agency's involvement in your claim, you may wish to contact the Greek Ombudsman, as the Authority legally mandated to handle fundamental rights related complaints.
