

Re: Your request for public access to documents of 26 April 2019

Dear [redacted]

I refer to the request for public access to documents in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001¹ (hereafter referred to as 'the PAD Regulation') and in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1367/2006², which you submitted on 26 April 2019 and which was acknowledged by EFSA on 30 April 2019, concerning:

"The CO2 balances (carbon footprint) of your authority in the last ten calendar years as well as the underlying calculation methods, if possible, in a machine-readable format."

Please allow us using English language in this reply to your request for public access which was made in German language. Having processed your request in accordance with the PAD Regulation, we have checked internally at EFSA on the existence of any document on the subject matter specified therein. As a result, we regret to inform you that EFSA does not possess any document which corresponds to your request for access. Please note that in application of the case law of the European Union Courts, a presumption of legality is attached to any statement made by an Institution concerning the non-existence of documents requested³.

We would like to add that EFSA currently is in contact with the competent service at the European Commission to find out how the annual carbon footprint data can be collected and processed in a reliable and coherent manner allowing for a comparison between EU Institutions, Agencies and Bodies.
