

Canada is active in Supply Chain initiatives

- Canada is engaged in implementing and promoting internationally recognized standards for supply chains, and expects companies to actively identify, prevent and mitigate their human rights impacts, aligned with internationally recognized guidance.
- As a leading diamond exporter, Canada was a **founding** member of the Kimberley Process (KP) Certification Scheme and is advancing KP reforms to ensure the ongoing relevance of the standard.
- Canada supported the development of and actively promotes the OECD Due Diligence Guidelines for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.









Responsible Sourcing in Canada and Abroad

- Canadian stakeholders are active in work to increase transparency and traceability throughout the supply chain, responding to consumer concerns & interest among manufacturers to demonstrate responsibly sourced materials.
- MAC's TSM is a framework for sustainable mining that is mandatory for MAC members operating in Canada.
- At home, the Government is developing a strong legal and regulatory framework, positioning Canada as a responsible source of supply & a trusted trade ally.
- Internationally, the Government works bilaterally to develop the capacity of host country governments in sustainable development, in concert with technical assistance provided by Canadian non-governmental organizations (e.g., IMPACT, CIRDI, IGF) and with MAC's international strategy for TSM.





Increasing Transparency & Deterring Corruption

Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative

- Global standard to improve transparency, accountability and good governance of oil and gas and mineral resources.
- Verification, reconciliation and full publication of extractive company payments made to host country governments and corresponding government revenues received, from oil, gas, and mining.
- EITI aligns payments with revenues to combat bribery and corruption, and fosters debate about how government revenues are spent.
- Canada is an EITI Supporting Country and a significant funder of the International Secretariat.

Extractive Sector Transparency Measures Act

- ESTMA is part of the international effort to fight corruption in the extractives sector and responds to Canada's G8 commitment to contribute to improved transparency.
- ESTMA requires extractive businesses subject to Canadian law to report payments made to all levels of government, domestically and abroad.
- ESTMA is aligned with global reporting requirements (e.g., EU & Quebec), and substitution determinations reduce reporting burden for companies operating in multiple jurisdictions.





Development Assistance Supporting Sustainability

Governments, civil society, private sector and local stakeholders enhancing capacity to responsibly and sustainably manage natural resources with a Feminist Approach:

- Addressing systematic barriers in governance systems
- Diversifying economic opportunities
- Strengthening the role of women in natural resource value chains
- Ensuring women, Indigenous peoples and marginalized groups are engaged in meaningful consultation and decision-making

- 2. Local economic development
- 3. Ensuring communities maximize benefits
