|     | Those include the Opposition Platform For Life (OPFL, represented by about 40 MPs in             |
|     | the Verkhovna Rada), which had support of 9-10%, as well as Nashi, a relatively young            |
|     | pro-Russian party with allegedly 5-6% of support, and a number of small parties. The             |
|     | Ministry of Justice is supposed to follow up on the decision with relevant legal steps. The      |
|     | NSDC decision was broadly supported in social media.   |
