



USE CASE | Vessels of Interest (VOI) list - CISE operational service








Maritime authorities can share lists of vessels of their interest through CISE





If/when a CISE participant detects the vessel from your VOI list, you will be informed





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USE CASE I CONCLUSIONS

CISE enables the gathering of **additional information** from different sources **beyond** a particular **authority's sectors and borders**, *including intelligence*.

This complementary information helps authorities :

- To obtain a more complete maritime picture,
- to plan well in advance,
- and to undertake necessary actions in a timely and efficient manner.








USE CASE II Vessels of Interest (VOI) list on the EU IUU list








EFCA shares the EU IUU vessel list through CISE using the VOI list service



Coast Guard (Authority A) updates the information of the VOI and disseminates to all authorities through CISE





The Traffic Control (Authority B) shares its findings through CISE
