Statement by Denmark, supported by Luxembourg and Sweden

"Denmark strongly supports the intention to have a Joint Declaration with Egypt on energy and climate, but regrets that the process has not allowed for substantial and proper inclusion of the Council in the negotiations. Furthermore, Denmark stresses the need for such documents to take their point of reference in the Council conclusions on climate diplomacy.

Denmark would like to underline that, in line with the NBI procedure, no substantive changes to the current draft of the Joint Statement should be made. Denmark would consider it a substantive change if the words "sustainable", "clean", "green", "renewable" or "low carbon" were substituted for one or the other. Additionally, Denmark would find it to be a substantive change if references to the Paris Agreement or the Glasgow Climate Pact were to be removed."

Statement by Hungary

"Regarding the reference to the Global Compact for Migration, Hungary reminds that it has not adopted the compact and is not participating in its implementation. Hungary does not share the view that migration can be a solution for demographic and labour market challenges. Instead of promoting, facilitating or managing migration, efforts should be made to reduce and eliminate the root causes of this phenomenon. The focus should be on providing assistance to third countries locally, by creating conditions more conductive to stable growth and development, thereby all owing people to stay and live in their home countries in peace and prosperity.

In view of the above, Hungary was able to accept the reference to the Global Compact for Migration in a spirit of compromise, having in mind the urgent need to conclude the Association Agenda, taking into account the partner's priorities; with the interpretation that implementation applies only to the Republic of Moldova and not to the Member States."
